



In the midst of Germany's semifinal romp over Brazil, a group of Rush Pikes Peak players met Lindsey Horan, one of Rush's most successful players.

Horan was in Colorado between the end of her professional season at Paris Saint – Germain (PSG) and the start of World Cup training camp for the United States Under – 20 National Team.

After describing her development within Rush and her time at PSG, Horan fielded questions from the players.
